"Yesterday's signing of the SUPPORT for Patients and Communities Reauthorization Act marks an important victory for families and communities nationwide. By renewing critical funding for overdose prevention, early detection, treatment access, and long-term recovery support, the President has reaffirmed our country's commitment to saving lives. This law builds on years of bipartisan progress, and with overdose deaths finally beginning to decline, it could not come at a more pivotal moment.

But our work is far from finished. We must continue building on our success and expand and strengthen access to treatment and recovery support services in our homes, workplaces, jails and prisons, and our communities. If we stay focused, committed, and grounded in evidence, we can end this crisis.
