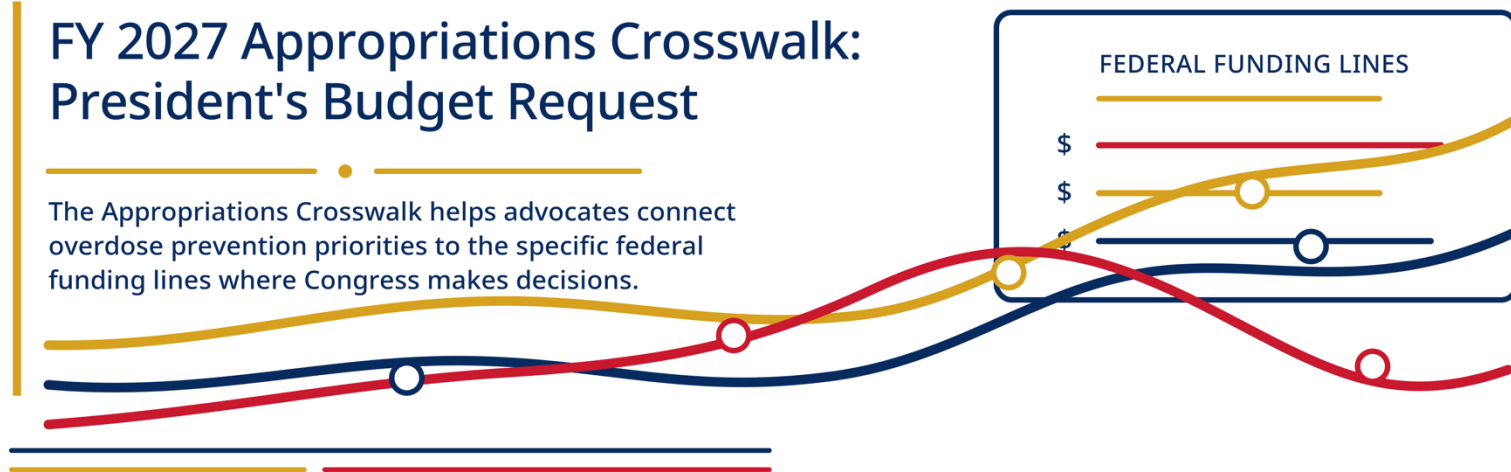


## FY 2027 Appropriations Crosswalk: President's Budget Request

The Appropriations Crosswalk helps advocates connect overdose prevention priorities to the specific federal funding lines where Congress makes decisions. It translates broad goals into the exact accounts, programs and bill language that determine what gets funded and what gets left behind. The Global Health Advocacy Incubator (GHA), Overdose Prevention Initiative built this crosswalk as a practical guide so partners can move from general funding requests to targeted, actionable asks that align with how appropriations staff work. Use it to find the right funding account for your priority, identify where report language can protect evidence-based programs, and make clearer requests to lawmakers that are easier to advance during negotiations.

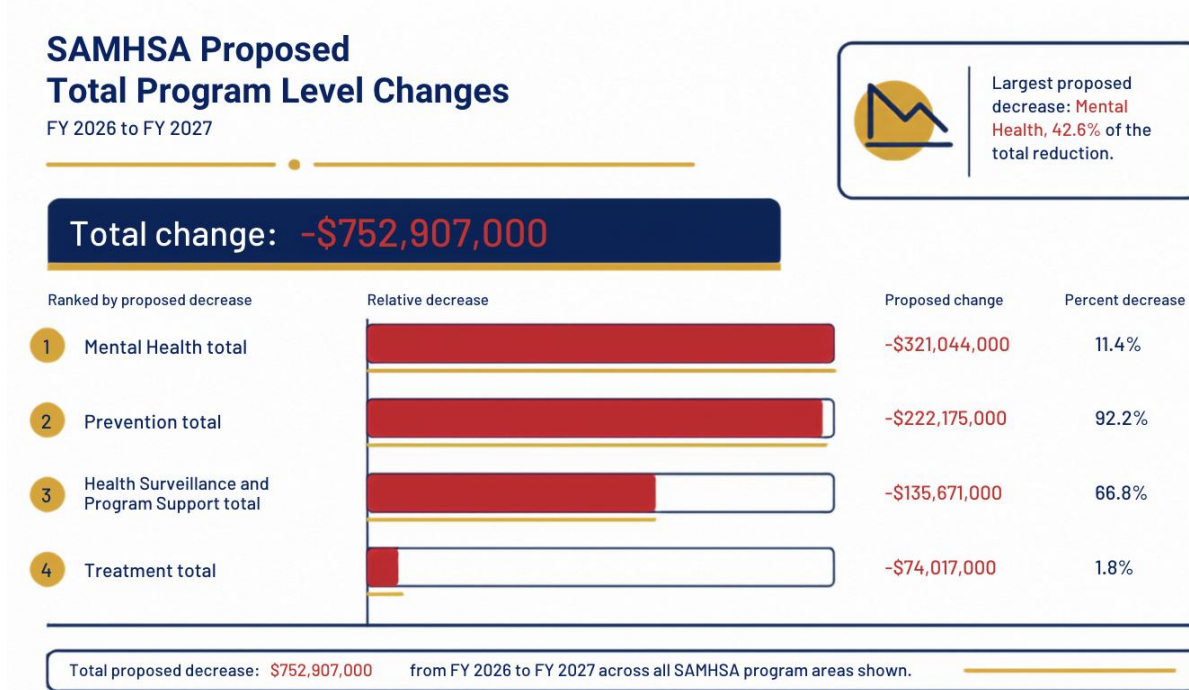

**Summary – SAMHSA Funding Overview:** The [Fiscal Year \(FY\) 2027 President’s Budget Request \(PBR\)](#) reflects the [proposed reorganization of HHS](#) and proposes decreased funding for SAMHSA’s total program level compared to final FY 2026 funding. These changes align with the FY 2026 PBR that was rejected when Congress provided increased funding to SAMHSA in the [final Fiscal Year \(FY\) 2026 appropriations bill](#) for the Departments of Labor, Health and Human Services, Education and Related Agencies.

- Treatment total: **-\$74,017,000**
- Mental Health total: **-\$321,044,000**
- Prevention total: **-\$222,175,000**
- Health Surveillance and Program Support total: **-\$135,671,000**

**Summary – SAMHSA PRNS:** The [Fiscal Year \(FY\) 2027 President’s Budget Request \(PBR\)](#) proposes various changes to SAMHSA’s Programs of Regional and National Significance (PRNS), a critical source of funding for mental health and substance use programs nationwide. Many of these programs were among the hundreds of grants, valued at an estimated \$2 billion, abruptly terminated overnight by the Administration on January 13, 2026, before being subsequently reinstated the following day.

While many SAMHSA PRNS were level-funded for FY 2026, the FY 2027 PBR proposes \$591.4 million in cuts to PRNS overall, including a \$74 million reduction across substance use treatment PRNS; \$295.2 million reduction across mental health PRNS; and \$222.2 million reduction across substance use prevention programs compared to final FY 2026 enacted funding levels.
