## Naloxone Readiness Checklist for World Cup Venues and Gathering Spaces

Every host city is planning for the whistle, the crowds and the celebration. They should also plan for the moments when a fast response can save a life.

### Before Each Event

- Assign a naloxone readiness lead.
- Identify high-traffic locations where people gather, wait, celebrate or move through crowded spaces.
- Place naloxone in visible, easy-to-access locations.
- Train staff, volunteers and shift leads on overdose signs and response steps.
- Confirm who calls 911, who gives naloxone, who meets EMS and who documents the incident.
- Coordinate with local public health, EMS, emergency management and venue medical teams.
- Create a restocking plan for used, expired or missing naloxone.
- Add naloxone locations to internal safety maps, staff briefings and event operations plans.



### Priority Placement Sites

- First aid stations
- Guest services desks
- Security posts
- Hotel front desks
- Nightclubs
- Restaurant and bar manager stations
- Fan festival medical tents
- Transit hubs
- Rideshare pickup zones
- Public viewing areas
- Volunteer check-in locations
- Mobile response teams



### Match Day Reminders

- Keep naloxone where staff can reach it quickly.
- Check supply at the start and end of each shift.
- Do not lock naloxone in a room only one person can access.
- Make sure night shift, security, guest services and hospitality staff know the plan.
- Restock immediately after use.
- Debrief after major match days and adjust placement if staff could not find or access naloxone quickly.
